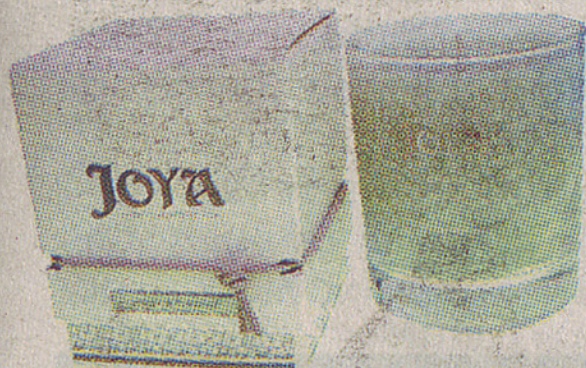

Brooklyn-crafted Joya candles are some of the few scented candles in the market that are made on the East Coast. (Little known candle fact: most of the



major brands are made in the west, says Frederick Bouchardy, the designer of Joya candles).

Using all-natural vegetable wax and vibrant colors, the candles have a special, almost sparkly, quality to them. Only a year old, the company has the distinct honor of being the first scented candle to be sold at the MoMA Design Store. The candles can be found on their Web site www.joyacandle.com.
